On behalf of Skate Australia Limited and Skate New South Wales, the Skate Australia Speed Technical Committee presents the 2024 Skate Australia Speed National Championships.

The 2024 Championships are open to skaters from all Skate Australia Limited affiliated State Associations as well as countries affiliated to World Skate. Approval letter from national federations for international skaters must accompany nominations.

The ROAD competition venue is located, <u>Jamieson Park Netball Courts</u>, York Road, Penrith, NSW 2750. Circuit dimensions and course diagram to be confirmed. Speed Officials and Speed Technical Meeting will be held at this venue on Sunday 14 January 2024 between 3:00 - 5:00 pm. State Team Road Training times will be advised after nominations close.

The FLAT TRACK competition venue is Whitlam Leisure Centre, 90A Memorial Avenue, Liverpool NSW. **Please note:** a wheel testing opportunity will be arranged by the Skate Australia Speed TC and Skate NSW, no private bookings will be accepted by the venue. Cost to be advised.

MARATHON venue to be confirmed. A tentative booking is currently held at the Narellan Criterium Circuit.

NOMINATIONS

- (a) State team members must be nominated by their delegated State Association representative via the Skate Australia revolutioniseSPORT platform.
- (b) All registration fields MUST be completed for each team member, including competitor number. Only registered Competitive members are eligible to be nominated in this event.
- (c) Each person nominated in a State Team must be a bona fide resident of Australia or its possessions by the 31 of December 2023. They must have lived in Australia for at least six (6) months prior to the 31 December 2023.
- (d) The competitor age is the age of the skater on the 31 December in the year of competition.
- (e) International skaters must nominate through the Skate Australia revolutioniseSPORT Event. All registration fields MUST be completed for each competitor. International skaters should also provide a letter of approval to compete from their home Federation.
- (f) ALL nominations close at 23:55 pm on Friday 1 December 2023.
- (g) Please see Appendix #1 for information relating to competition categories and race distances.

SPONSORED SKATERS

All sponsored skaters who wish to compete in a sponsored skinsuit should provide to the Skate Australia Speed Technical Committee Chairperson, Pauline Robertson (rollersportswa@gmail.com) via their State Team Managers, a letter from the sponsor by 1 December 2023. Skaters who do not submit a letter by the due date will be required to compete in their respective State Team Skinsuit.

PAYMENT OF REGISTRATION FEES

Following the close of nominations, each affiliated State Association will receive an invoice from the Skate Australia Speed Technical Committee for the total amount owing of all nominations entered into the Skate Australia revolutioniseSPORT platform for their state team.

International competitors will be issued an invoice from the Skate Australia Speed Technical Committee for payment of their nomination fees via international bank transfer.

Please DO NOT pay at time of nomination or transfer funds into any Skate Australia bank accounts without having received an invoice in the first instance.

COMPETITION RULES

Current World Skate Speed Technical Commission Regulations, Skate Australia Speed Technical Committee Australian Rules will be applied as necessary. As this is the pinnacle championship event for Skate Australia, wheel restrictions do not apply.

COMPETITOR NUMBER PATCHES

States are to provide their own speed number patches. All competitor numbers must be provided at time of nominating state team members. The numbers must be worn by the competitor throughout the championships. Three number patches shall be worn by each competitor — one on the lower back and one on each hip as per the World Skate Speed Technical Commission regulations.

International competitors will be provided with numbers prior to the first day of competition.

TEAM MANAGERS & TEAM COACHES

Affiliated State Associations are to supply to the Skate Australia Speed Technical Committee Chairperson, on request, a list of team coaches and team managers, including current Skate Australia membership number and relevant State Working with Children card.

Only current accredited (and updated) nominated State Coaches and Team Managers will be allowed in the marshalling area.

SPORT INTEGRITY AUSTRALIA – ANTI DOPING ELEARNING REQUIREMENTS

Skate Australia works closely with Sport Integrity Australia, the national agency established to protect sport against integrity and anti-doping threats. For more information visit the **Sport Integrity Australia** website.

All competitors twelve (12) years of age and older who compete in a National Championship event must complete at a minimum, Anti-Doping Fundamentals (formerly Level 1), Annual Update 2024 (formerly Level 2) and Competition Manipulation & Sports Betting.

For competitors under the age of twelve (12), Clean Sport 101 completed in conjunction with their parent/guardian is advisable.

In due course State Team Managers will be advised the procedure for lodging their team's eLearning Certificates.

International competitors should provide an up-to-date certificate from their Country's Anti-Doping Agency or from WADA on arrival at the competition.

All State Coaches, State Team Managers and officials are required to complete the same SIA eLearning courses as is expected of competitors.
